

# Construction of democracy



- imaginary, an abstraction, a socially constructed phenomenon
- dependent on human interaction for its existence
- can make provisions for civic virtue or areté
- the negotiable abstraction of democracy is reified singularly in the citizenry
- individuals to propose new spaces for politics

The emerging model of the digitally enabled citizen is liquid and reflexive to contemporary civic realities, but also removed from civic habits of the past


### Facebook in democracy

disciplined to become private and personal in a public or political sphere


- staging the presentation of our identities






### In the modern polis
